WASHINGTON, D.C. - Today, Congressman Chris Murphy (CT-5) and a bipartisan group of Members of Congress met with Ron Bloom, the White House's Senior Counselor for Manufacturing Policy, to talk about the future of manufacturing in Connecticut and across the country.

"Manufacturing is a vital part of Connecticut's economy.
